

## PRONUNCIATION OF PAST SIMPLE REGULAR

**/t/ for voiceless consonants.** Verbs with their infinitive finishing in the sounds /p/, /s/, /ʃ/, /tʃ/, /k/. *Spanish tip:* **chofer** (“ch” is /ʃ/,/tʃ/,) con **pekas**

*English tip:* **Chuck pushes** (Chuck is short for Charles)

worked /t/

pushed /t/

watched /t/

tossed /t/

fixed /t/ “x” is pronounced /ks/ here.

hiccoughed /t/ gh here is pronounced /p/

**/d/ for voiced consonants.** Verbs whose infinitive end in the rest of sounds, including vocalic sounds and semivowels.

lived /d/

returned/d/

screamed /d/

cried /d/ we have just a vowel here /aɪ/

**/ɪd/** only verbs with the infinitive ending in /t/ or /d/ sounds

Shouted /ɪd/

Needed /ɪd/

Decided /ɪd/

Landed
